*As of September 12, 2023, CDC recommends everyone 6 months and older get an updated COVID-19 vaccine to protect against the potentially serious outcomes of COVID-19 illness this fall and winter. Updated COVID-19 vaccines from Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna will be available. Anyone 6 months or older who completed a primary COVID-19 vaccination series OR received a booster dose at least two months ago should get the updated booster. ### The Boston Public High School Scholarship

High school seniors graduating from a Boston Public High School who are in the top 10 percent of their graduating class are eligible for this scholarship. Each high school may nominate up to two candidates for the award. Additional candidates may also be identified through Northeastern's general application evaluation process. Applicants must have extensive engagement in their local school communities and a commitment to service within the city. If you believe you're a good candidate for this scholarship, please speak with your school counselor about the nomination process.

## Public Comment Period: Massachusetts Internet for All Plan


Over the last six months, MBI has been on a mission to hear from residents across the state about their experiences accessing and using the internet. MBI has now developed a strategic plan to guide the investment of millions of federal dollars to close the digital divide and ensure universal broadband availability across the Commonwealth. To ensure they got it right they are receiving **public comments** from **now until December 15, 2023**! **AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM**

**WHAT IS IT?**  
The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service.

**The benefit provides:**

- Up to \$30/month discount for internet service;
- Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying Tribal lands; and
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider.

**WHO IS ELIGIBLE?**  
A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program if the household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, or if a member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below:

- Participates in any of the following assistance programs: SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits, SSI, WIC, or Lifeline;
- Participates in any of the following Tribal specific programs: Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal TANF, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations, or Tribal Head Start (income based);
- Participates in the Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating broadband provider's existing low-income internet program.

Contact your preferred participating provider to select an eligible plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete.

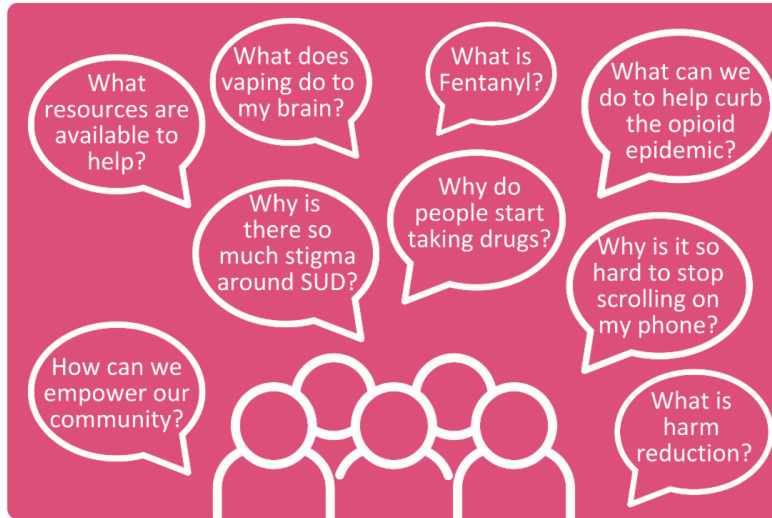

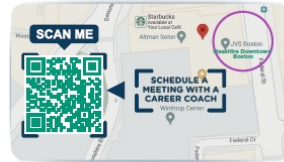
